Entitled, That's What She Said, the conference welcomed close to 500 participants who traveled from across Canada and the US. Generously hosted by the University of Toronto (UofT), the conference presented masterclasses and lectures, classes for younger and more advanced performers, and it held the Joan Watson Excerpt Competition, which offered cash prizes. On the last day, a silent auction, vendor marketplace, and chamber brass performances filled the lobby. In the tradition of IWBC, the event culminated with a performance by the Viceroy Brass, featuring an impressive collection of players from orchestras across Canada, including the Toronto Symphony, Orchestre Symphonique de Montreal, The National Ballet Orchestra, The Canadian Opera Company, and members of the Canadian Armed Forces.
